
INTERESTED IN MAKING A DIFFERENCE IN KIDS' LIVES?

Covid-19 Testing Protocol for Camp

The American Diabetes Association (ADA) in agreement with the Center for Disease Control (CDC) are no longer requiring COVID vaccines for the 2023 season. They still highly recommend that everyone is vaccinated but it is no longer required.

In an effort to continue following ADA requirements, yet to also continue to protect all campers while still providing equal access to camp this year, Camp Sweet Life will be conducting Covid-19 testing for all campers, staff, and volunteers upon entrance to camp. Anyone wishing to participate in the camp experience must test negative for Covid-19 regardless of vaccination status.

If you are sick and suspect that you have Covid-19 prior to camp, you are welcome to test at home before making the trip to camp. Regardless of your test result at home, we will still be testing all individuals upon entry. No pictures of negative tests will be accepted.

If you test positive in the days leading up to camp, please be sure to follow the guidelines put forth by the <u>Center for Disease Control (CDC)</u>.
